The Culture, Science and Technology Program

The program enables students to explore areas of interest while they earn credits that transfer easily to a four-year program. The program encourages students to engage in study groups and study skill development workshops, and utilize tutors and other resources at the College's Learning Laboratory to expand their learning opportunities.

- information sessions on academic and career opportunities

- transfer easily to four-year programs related to their concentration areas
