**General Information:** This guide outlines an agreement between CCP and Alvernia College. If a student earns an AAS degree in Behavioral Health/Human Services at CCP, he/she is assured of third-year status in the Addiction Studies bachelor program at Alvernia. The student must enroll at Alvernia within two year of earning the AAS degree. Only courses with a grade of “C” or higher are accepted. After earning the AAS degree, a student may earn a bachelor degree within 18 months. The outline below specifies the BHHS degree to Alvernia requirements. Alvernia accepts up to 75 credits. Alvernia’s main campus is in Reading, PA, however, the Addictions Counseling degree is offered in Elkins Park, Montgomery County. **Note: This guide is based on CCP degree requirements for students who entered the BHHS curriculum through summer 2009. Students who enter the curriculum fall 2009 or after should consult BHHS curriculum advisors about curriculum changes.**
