General Information: CCP and Arcadia University have come to an agreement. Students who complete the AA in Education—Secondary Humanities/Citizenship Option as outlined in this guide transfer with third-year status to Arcadia’s teacher preparation program. This allows a full-time student to complete the Arcadia degree in four regular semesters. To enroll in Arcadia under terms of the agreement, students must complete the AA degree at CCP. For formal admission to the Department of Education and Teacher Certification, students must achieve a GPA of 3.0 and must pass the Praxis I test in reading writing and math. Credit for grades less than “C” in courses will not be accepted as transfer credit. **Please note the differences between Citizenship and Humanities in course selection. Also Note: The PA Dept. of Education is stipulating changes in requirements for teacher certification programs at four-year institutions. Consult with Education curriculum advisors for updates.**
