General Information: This guideline outlines an agreement between CCP and Drexel University’s Behavioral and Addictions Counseling Sciences Program. If a student earns an AAS degree in Behavioral Health/Human Services at CCP, with a GPA of 2.5 or higher, he/she is assured of third-year status in the BACS Bachelor of Science degree program at Drexel. The student must enroll in the BACS program within two years of earning the AAS degree. Only courses with a grade of “C” or higher are accepted. After earning the AAS degree, a student may earn a bachelor degree within two years. The outline below specifies the BHHS degree to BACS requirements. Drexel accepts up to 90 semester credits. The Blue-Gold Connection is available to those applying for full-time, day admission. Students are also encouraged to consider completing this course of study through the Goodwin College of Professional Studies. The Goodwin College conducts the Saturday Scholars Program which allows students to complete this degree, on Saturdays, at a significant tuition reduction. It is important to note that the Blue-Gold Connection is not available to students interested in the Saturday Scholars Program, as Blue-Gold is only available for full-time, day students.
