General Information: The following is an outline of a 2+2 agreement between CCP and Drexel for students interested in elementary education. Students who complete these requirements earn an Associate in Arts in Education and eligible to enroll in third year courses at Drexel, College of Arts & Sciences, Teacher Preparation Curriculum. Deadlines for application and payment of fees to Drexel must be met as with any student who applies to the University. Students interested in the Blue Gold Connection should see dual admissions . It is important to note that the State of Pennsylvania, through Chapter 354, has increased GPA requirements for student admission and persistence in teacher certification programs. In order to implement the requirement, Drexel requires that a student earn a 3.0 cumulative GPA to enter teacher certification courses. Students also must take the PRAXIS Test I: Pre-professional Skills Tests in order to be admitted to teacher education. Students can be admitted to the University without the PRAXIS, but they will need to successfully complete the test before official admission to the teacher preparation program. CCP education advisors should be consulted about GPA requirements and the PRAXIS test.
