General Information: This guide outlines an agreement between the Education Curriculum at CCP and the Education Program at Eastern University. If a student earns an A.A. in Education at CCP by completing the curriculum as recommended in this guide, the student transfers to Eastern with junior status. For admission to teacher education in the academic year 2002-2003 students must earn a cumulative 2.8 gpa and a passing score on the Praxis I Pre-professional Skills Test. For the year 2003-2004, the gpa must be 3.0 in addition to passing scores on the Praxis. Students must enroll at Eastern within two years after CCP graduation. Note: The PA Dept. of Education is stipulating changes in requirements for teacher certification programs at four-year institutions. Consult with Education curriculum advisors for updates.

Complete second course from EASC 111 Environmental Conservation or PHYS 108 Descriptive Astronomy	Natural Science Requirement
Complete one English Literature Course Numbered ENGL 208 to 260	English Literature Elective, Education Dept. Entrance Requirement

Foreign Language, Two semester sequence	Students who have had three year of one language in high school with a grade of "B" or better need only complete one course for the CCP requirement. All other students are recommended to complete two semesters of the same language.
