<p>Program begins in September or January. Can be completed in two semesters if one attends full-time. Part-time day. To matriculate as degree-seeking student at Thomas Jefferson University, must have RN license. CCP has signed an affiliate agreement with TJU. The affiliate agreement states that if a student completes all prerequisite courses with at least a 2.7 cumulative grade point average, and submits two letters of recommendation (one from a personal, professional or academic source and one from Dr. Mary Anne Celenza, Dean for Math, Science and Health Careers at CCP, 215-751-8430, Rm. W2-7) the student is admitted to TJU provided that there is space in the program. Before the dean makes a final recommendation, a student must be in the final stages of completing the program prerequisites and must arrange an interview with Dr. Celenza. At the interview, a student should provide to Dr. Celenza a brief biographical summary or resume. Even though the minimum GPA required is 2.7, TJU recommends at least a 3.0, and the dean must agree that the student is qualified for admission to TJU. Students with disciplinary or criminal records are excluded from a guarantee of admission. Students are recommended to apply to Jefferson early in the full term that precedes the term of desired enrollment.</p>
