**General Information: General Information:** Community College of Philadelphia and Philadelphia University have signed a Philadelphia University Community Scholars agreement. A student who completes the AA in Liberal Arts—Social/Behavioral Science as explained in this guide and who earns at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA is considered a Community Scholar with junior standing. The student must transfer to the full-time day program at Philadelphia University within two years of graduation from CCP and must commute to the University. **A scholarship which equals 50% of the annual tuition of Philadelphia University is awarded to the student. The application fee is waived.** Only grades of ‘C’ or higher transfer. Students who do not meet the GPA requirement are not covered by the agreement but can use the information below to transfer credits to the University.
