General Information: This guide outlines an agreement between CCP and Saint Joseph's University. If a student earns an A.A.S. in Justice with at least a 2.5 GPA, he/she may transfer with third year status to the traditional full time day program or the University College Bridge Program (a 2.0 GPA is required for admission to the University College's evening division). Students must enroll at St. Joseph's within two years after graduating from CCP. Full time students under the age of 22 must apply to the traditional day program. University College students may enroll as full time or part time students. Students must complete the following course requirements: **Note: This guide is based on CCP degree requirements for students who entered the Justice curriculum through summer 2009. Students who enter the curriculum fall 2009 or after should consult justice curriculum advisors about curriculum changes.**

In consultation with an advisor or counselor, choose one humanities course from the following: ART 103, ART 104, ENGL 107, ENGL 116, ENGL 208, ENGL 209, ENGL 221, ENGL 260, FREN 101, FREN 102, HUM 101, HUM 102, ITAL 101, ITAL 102, MUS 103, MUS 105, MUS 106, MUS 120, MUS 121, PHIL 101, PHIL 211, PHIL 151, PHIL 152, SPAN 101 or SPAN 102.	All of these courses have been identified by Saint Joseph's University as recommended electives for fulfilling a B.S. in Criminal Justice. Students wishing to enter the traditional day program at St. Joseph's should take one of the following Community College courses to fulfill the one ART/LIT requirement at St. Joseph's: ART 103, ART 104, ENG 209, ENG 221, OR MUS 103.
Students usually need two more directed electives to complete AAS requirements for a total of at least 60 credits. These can be additional courses from the social science and humanities lists above or they can be other general electives. Consult with a justice advisor.
