**General Information:** The following is an outline between the Business Curriculum at CCP and the Fox School of Business at Temple. If a student earns an AA in Business at CCP, the student transfers with junior standing to any major in the School of Business. At least a 3.0 GPA is required to transfer to the Entrepreneurship or International Business majors. Students planning to transfer to Finance, Real Estate, or Marketing must earn at least a 2.75 GPA. All other majors require at least a 2.3 GPA.

Students enrolled in the CCP Business curriculum are eligible for the **dual admissions agreement** with Temple. Please read the information at the Temple Dual Admissions available on the Career and Transfer Center bulletin board. The dual admissions agreement stipulates that students must satisfy all requirements for the CCP associate degree.

Students who first enroll at CCP in Fall 1996 or after are also eligible for the **core-to-core agreement**. The core-to-core stipulates that a student who earns the AA satisfies all Temple University core requirements except in cases in which the student's major requires certain courses. The core-to-core student must complete two writing intensive courses after transfer to Temple. A student with an earned AA is accepted as a core-to-core student at the time Temple receives the student's final transcript. **Students who do not earn an AA or who earned credits prior to Fall 1996 are responsible for the University core requirement.** See core requirement transfer guide in the transfer files of the CCP Career and Transfer Center (West Bldg., 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Rm. Two Math Electives: MATH 162-171 Precalculus II and Calculus I recommended. MATH 165-166 Differential Calculus I and II also appropriate. MATH 151-152 Linear Math and Probability satisfy School of Business math requirements, but Temple warns that students may not be prepared for future quantitative course work if MATH 151-152 completed. <b>Beginning with students who enter Temple in Fall 2008, MATH 151 and 152 is no longer acceptable.</b> Intended actuary science students should complete MATH 171-172 and 271 before transfer. MATH 271 can be used as one of three free electives.	Quantitative Reasoning – 2 course sequence required for Business Core Requirement
Two Social Science Electives: ECON 114 Business Statistics II one elective for all students except for intended actuary science majors. Second elective can be any course from ANTH, EASC, EDUC, GEOG, HIST (can be used as a social science or humanities, but not both), POLS, PSYC, SOC, SSCI, WS. Students not eligible for core-to-core (any student who completed courses prior to Fall '96) should complete ECON 114 and consult a counselor or advisor in reference to second course. Actuary science students should choose two social science electives from the subjects listed above.
