<p><b>General Information:</b> The following outlines an agreement between the Liberal Arts—Social/Behavioral Science curriculum at CCP and the Psychology Department in the College of Liberal Arts at Temple. If a student earns an A.A. in Liberal Arts—Social/Behavioral Science at CCP, the student transfers with junior standing to the Psychology major in the College of Liberal Arts.</p> <p>Students enrolled in the Liberal Arts—Social/Behavioral Science curriculum are eligible for the <u>dual admissions agreement</u>. The dual admissions agreement stipulates that students must satisfy all requirements for the associate degree. Students who first enroll at CCP in Fall 1996 or after are also eligible for the <b>core-to-core agreement</b>. The core-to-core stipulates that a student who earns the A.A. satisfies all Temple University core requirements except in cases in which the student’s major requires certain courses. The core-to-core student must complete two writing intensive courses after transfer to Temple. A student with an earned A.A. is accepted as a core-to-core student at the time Temple receives the student’s final transcript. Students who do not earn an A.A. are responsible for the University core requirement. See core requirement transfer guide in the transfer files of the CCP Career and Transfer Center (West Bldg., 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Rm. 2—W2-2, 215-751-8168).</p> <p><b>(Note: Two courses from PSYC 205, 211, 215, and 221 can be used toward the Temple psychology major. The courses can be used toward A.A. degree categories of “advanced or sequential social science”, “general electives” or “concentration electives”. Additional courses completed from this list and other psychology courses transfer as free electives.)</b></p>

Consult with an advisor or counselor on the appropriate way to satisfy CCP and Temple requirements.</p>	<p>The College of Liberal Arts requires students to satisfy competency in at least the second semester of a foreign language. ASL does not count toward the foreign language requirement. Courses other than foreign language may satisfy international studies core or the general Core-to-Core agreement. Students who can read and write a language other than English may not be required to complete language courses.</p>
<p>Advanced or Sequential Social Science Elective: Complete one course that is advanced or sequential to a social science course previously completed. Consult advisor or counselor about appropriate course.</p>	<p>Core-to-Core Agreement, International Studies Core or Major Requirement</p>
<p>Advanced or sequential humanities elective: Complete one course that is advanced or sequential to the humanities—international emphasis elective or complete one 200-level English course. <p>Social Science Elective: Complete one course from a social science discipline not previously studied. ANTH, EASC, ECON, EDUC, GEOG, HIST (can count as humanities or social science, but not both), POLS, SOC, SSCI, WS</p>	<p>Core-to-Core Agreement</p>
<p>Advanced or Sequential Social Science Elective: Complete one course that is advanced or sequential to a social science course previously completed. Consult advisor or counselor about appropriate course.</p>	<p>Core-to-Core Agreement, International Studies Core or Major Requirement</p>

General Electives: Complete two courses in consultation with an advisor or counselor.	Core-to-Core Agreement, Foreign Language Core, International Studies Core or Major Requirement
Concentration Electives: Complete three courses that have a unifying focus. Could include psychology and statistics (MATH 251 or ECON 112) courses not used for other requirements.
