<b>General Information:</b> Students who expect to receive the A.A.S. in Nursing degree from Community College of Philadelphia and want to continue to Temple University for a Bachelor's degree should apply from 10 to 12 months before the term of entrance. Courses that may be completed at Community College are listed below. The last 30 credits must be from Temple. Temple courses for the BSN degree can be completed at the Northeast Regional Center of the Community College.	
Students who earn 45 or more transferable credits qualify for the "45+ Core" requirement. The 31 credits granted for NURS 101, 132, 231, 232 <b>ARE NOT</b> counted toward these 45 credits. Students who follow the "45+ Core" can take: 1) one course from the arts requirement <u>or</u> the American Culture requirement; 2) one course from the International Studies <u>or</u> at least the 2 <sup>nd</sup> semester of a foreign language (not ASL); and 3) one course from HUM 101 or HUM 102 and one course for studies in race. <b>All other requirements must be completed as listed on this guide.</b> Check with a CCP counselor if you have questions.
