General Information: This guide outlines an agreement between the CCP liberal arts—gender studies/women's studies curriculum and the women's studies major at Temple. Student who complete the AA in liberal arts and are admitted to Temple transfer with junior standing. Students are recommended to take advantage of the **dual admissions agreement**. Dual admissions guarantees admission to the university for anyone who earns the AA with at least a 2.3 GPA. Students who earn at least a 3.3 GPA under the dual admissions agreement are guaranteed scholarship money. For more information, talk to a counselor or advisor or see the dual admissions information on the bulletin board in the Career and Transfer Center (rm. W2-3). A **core-to-core** agreement is also in place with Temple. Students with the earned AA satisfy all university core requirements except in cases in which the major stipulates certain requirements. Core requirements of international studies and foreign language are stipulated by women's studies. The student must also complete two writing intensive courses after transfer to Temple. **Students who do not earn an AA are responsible for the university core requirement. See core requirement guideline for more information.**
