HIGHLIGHTS IN PHILANTHROPIC GIVING

Your generosity to the CCP Foundation reached nearly every area of the College in support of student and academic success—scholarships, emergency aid, workforce development, faculty excellence, global learning and more.

Faculty Excellence and Workforce Innovation



More than \$1 million was directed to strengthen **teaching** and **workforce education**. These funds supported an endowed faculty chair, stipends for Nursing and workforce faculty, academic and student departmental needs, faculty and student study abroad, and student support services. Investments like these ensure students learn from faculty who are not only experts in their field but also deeply engaged in advancing excellence in the classroom and beyond.

PepsiCo Uplift Scholars



In February, College leaders and **PepsiCo** representatives recognized the **83 recipients** of the **2024-2025 PepsiCo Foundation Uplift Scholarship**. Through a **\$172,500 award**, students pursuing credit degrees and certificates gained access to critical support made possible by a national initiative of the American Association of Community Colleges.



Nursing Scholarships



With **21 dedicated Nursing scholarships** awarding a combined **\$96,272** this year, 97 students advanced toward careers in health care. Loyal partners like Independence Foundation and Independence Blue Cross Foundation made this possible. CCP's Nursing program continues to excel, with **90% pass rates for first-time national licensing exam** takers and **100% job placement** for graduates.

The Berkman Fund



Former CCP Foundation Director **Richard L. Berkman, Esq.**, pledged **\$500,000 over 5 years** to strengthen workforce instruction and student success. In year one, the **Berkman Fund** supported faculty fellowships in **welding** and **electro-mechanical technology**, funded 20 workforce scholarships, and provided 131 students with emergency basic needs support.

Mr. Berkman also established the **Berkman-Seidl PBAD Scholarship for Nursing Students** with an additional **\$50,000 gift**, which supported 15 nursing students in the 2024-2025 academic year.

HIGHLIGHTS FROM PUBLIC AND GOVERNMENTAL SUPPORT

Institutional Advancement, in partnership with College divisions, raised more than \$10 million through competitive public and government contracts and grants, and public/private partnerships such as the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program. The funding supported innovation in teaching, learning, workforce development, and facility construction/improvements, ensuring that CCP students have access to resources, opportunities, and support that drive academic and career success.

A grant to transform biotechnology education with a student-centered approach designed to build a more diverse STEM workforce

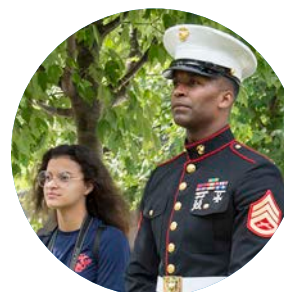

SCHOLARSHIP IMPACT

The CCP Foundation **awarded 1,042 scholarships totaling more than \$1.6 million** in Fiscal Year 2025. Scholarship recipients are more than three times as likely to graduate compared to nonrecipients.

Student Spotlight: Kamal Rhodes '25



"The scholarships I received give me extra motivation to succeed because I feel you are depending on me now. Supporting me shows that you believe in me."

Kamal earned his associate degree in Architecture in May 2025 and was one of two CCP students last year to receive the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship. A young father who once paused his education to support his family, Kamal is now pursuing his bachelor's degree at Thomas Jefferson University with the goal of becoming a licensed architect. An entrepreneur, he also launched a catering business during the pandemic.

SUPPORTING BASIC NEEDS

Basic needs support helps students stay enrolled and focused on their goals—removing barriers that can derail their education.

Thanks to generous support from the **MarcDavid Foundation**, **MetLife Foundation**, **the Elizabeth and Paul Shay Fund**, the **Leo and Peggy Pierce Family Foundation**, and others, the Foundation **increased emergency aid funding by 41%**, from \$347,000 in FY24 to \$491,654 in FY25. This growth enabled the College to distribute **2,006 Emergency Fund awards**, with transportation, food, and rent together accounting for 75% of the aid, along with additional support for books and other essentials.

Student Spotlight: Yasmeen Kenya

"Emergency funds gave me more than financial relief. The support gave me the ability to focus, persevere and succeed. I am a testimony that it is never too late to return and pursue your dreams."



Yasmeen Kenya is a Dental Hygiene student who returned to college in her 40s to pursue a long-held dream after life's challenges delayed her path. After being accepted into the Dental Hygiene program, Yasmeen faced limited access to traditional financial aid while balancing full-time studies and caring for her family.

With support from the College's Single Stop office, Yasmeen received emergency funding and resources that helped her stay focused and engaged in her coursework, clinical training, and commitment to service, earning scholarships and honor society recognition.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

With support from engaged donors, the Foundation **increased support for workforce students by an extraordinary 310%**, more than \$483,000, **rising from 63 scholarships in fiscal year 2024 to 258 in fiscal year 2025**. These scholarships enable students to gain hands-on training for high-demand careers that strengthen Philadelphia's workforce.



Workforce scholarships reach students College-wide, opening doors to career-focused programs that lead directly to family-sustaining jobs. At the Northeast Regional Center, scholarships are helping students pursue Massage Therapy, Commercial Truck Driving (CDL) and Certified Nurse Aide (CNA) programs. The Career and Advanced Technology Center in West Philadelphia supports training in transportation technologies, health care, and advanced manufacturing programs, equipping students with the skills employers need most.

Student Spotlight: Raymond McLaughlin



"Being selected for a scholarship made me feel like one of one. It filled me with an unimaginable amount of joy and gratitude to have this opportunity to learn and build a better future for myself and my family."

Raymond McLaughlin joined the CNC Machining program at the Career and Advanced Technology Center with the support of the Sidewater Workforce Scholarship. Raymond credits the scholarship as his pathway to a stable, higher-paying career that will allow him to support himself and his family. Through hands-on training and guidance from CCP faculty, he gained the skills and confidence needed to enter the machining field, and he now works at Global, a 1st Flagship Company, where he is proudly building his future.

The **Hilda & Preston Davis Foundation** fully funded eight Welding students (\$48,000), while the **Chappell Culpeper Family Foundation** provided more than \$133,000 to cover tuition for 14 students in CNC Precision Machining Technology and Welding.
